New staff in September will need training audit to identify individual needs.</p> <p>This is additional swimming tuition which enables pupils to make early progress in swimming. All pupils make gains. Children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 3 have taken part in this scheme and we have seen on average a 72% increase in the children's swimming ability.</p> <p>As a growing school we have an increasing need for more equipment and this year we have looked particularly at extending the range of equipment to include orienteering activities. We have also linked this to a walk to school project around geocaches. The equipment ensures not only good access to</p>
