This has</p>	<p>Improved knowledge of P.E. and pupils’ skill acquisition staff who received in-house coaching, therefore increasing the quality of P.E. teaching. – Staff reported feeling more competent and confident to deliver the PE Curriculum. With new staff starting an audit of training needs will be done in Autumn 2017.</p> <p>This is additional swimming tuition which enabled pupils to make early progress in swimming. All pupils make gains. Children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 3 have taken part in this scheme and we have seen on average a 75% increase in the children’s swimming ability. These children should all achieve expected outcomes by the end of KS2 in 2021/22 and 2022/23. (2016/17 Y6 cohort only 15% achieved expected outcomes at Y3 which highlighted the need for this intervention.</p> <p>As a growing school we have an increasing need for more equipment and this year we have purchased a range of small apparatus to encourage physical activity during playtimes</p>
